

**RINGKASAN**  
**ASUHAN KEBIDANAN**  
**PADA NY. A MASA HAMIL SAMPAI KB DAN NEONATUS**  
**DI PUSKESMAS PACIRAN**

Asuhan kebidanan berkelanjutan (continuity of care) yaitu pemberian asuhan kebidanan sejak kehamilan, bersalin, nifas, neonatus hingga memutuskan menggunakan KB. Ini bertujuan sebagai upaya untuk membantu memantau dan mendeteksi adanya kemungkinan timbulnya komplikasi yang menyertai ibu dan bayi dari masa kehamilan sampai ibu menggunakan KB. Adapun tujuan dari penyusunan Laporan *Continuity of Care* ini untuk memberikan asuhan kebidanan berkelanjutan dan melakukan dokumentasi SOAP pada ibu hamil, bersalin, massa nifas dan KB dengan menggunakan menejemen kebidanan.

Metode yang digunakan penulis yaitu *Continuity of Care* dengan penerapan manajemen varney dan pendokumentasian SOAP dalam bentuk wawancara, observasi pasien di Puskesmas Paciran. Metode yang diberikan pada asuhan kebidanan berkelanjutan dilakukan di Puskesmas Paciran.

Asuhan kebidanan diberikan kepada Ny. "A" pada masa hamil usia kandungan 35 minggu sampai KB dan neonatus di Puskesmas Paciran berlangsung ± 8 minggu mulai dari tanggal 9 Oktober 2023 hingga 8 Desember 2023 . Kunjungan dilakukan 9x, mulai masa kehamilan 1 kali kunjungan yaitu usia kehamilan 35 minggu, ibu mengalami pusing kadang-kadang yang merupakan masalah fisiologis dalam kehamilan. Ny A bersalin di Puskesmas Paciran. Kunjungan bersalin kala 1 di Puskesmas Paciran. Kunjungan nifas 3, kunjungan neonatus 3 kali terdapat keluhan ruam popok pada kunjungan ke tiga, dan konseling KB sebanyak 1 kali, dilakukan pemberian edukasi tentang KB Suntik yang akan digunakan oleh pasien, evaluasi terakhir Ny.A sepakat menggunakan KB Suntik 3 Bulan setelah masa nifas selesai.

Dengan dilakukannya CoC dari kehamilan sampai dengan KB dapat diketahui bahwa keadaan ibu dan bayi sehat dan tidak ada penyakit serta komplikasi.

**SUMMARY OF MIDWIFERY CARE  
ON NY. A PREGNANCY TO KB AND NEONATUS

Continuous midwifery care (continuity of care), namely providing midwifery care from pregnancy, delivery, postpartum, neonate until the decision to use family planning. This aims to help monitor and detect possible complications that accompany the mother and baby from pregnancy until the mother uses family planning. The aim of preparing this Continuity of Care Report is to provide continuous midwifery care and carry out SOAP documentation for pregnant women, giving birth, postpartum mass and family planning using midwifery management.

The method used by the author is Continuity of Care with the application of varney management and SOAP documentation in the form of interviews, patient observations at the Paciran Community Health Center. The method provided for sustainable midwifery care is carried out at the Paciran Community Health Center.

Midwifery care was provided to Mrs. "A" in the pregnancy period of 35 weeks until birth control and neonates at the Paciran Health Center lasts □ 8 weeks starting from 9 October 2023 to 8 December 2023. There were 9 visits, starting from the pregnancy period, 1 visit, namely 35 weeks of gestation, the mother sometimes experienced dizziness which was a physiological problem in pregnancy. Mrs A gave birth at the Paciran Community Health Center. 1st stage maternity visit at the Paciran Community Health Center. 3 postpartum visits, 3 neonate visits, there were complaints of diaper rash on the third visit, and 1 time family planning counseling, education was provided about the injectable birth control that would be used by the patient, the final evaluation Mrs. A agreed to use injectable birth control 3 months after the postpartum period finished.

By carrying out CoC from pregnancy to family planning, it can be seen that the condition of the mother and baby is healthy and there are no difficulties or complications.
